It is my recommendation that students do not purchase black binders for use in other classes. This way they can easily remember that the black binder goes to math. They can quickly grab the binder from their locker, confident that they have the correct binder.

*Students are required to purchase two different sized binders to aid in organization. The ½” binder will be used on a daily basis and contain the current unit’s notes, homework, quizzes and other essential papers. This is the binder that will travel between school and home on a daily basis. After each test, the ½” binder will be emptied into the 3” binder which will be stored in the math classroom. The purpose of the system is two-fold. The first purpose is to aid the students in maintaining organization of all notes and assignments. Students will have access to their notes on a daily basis as they will be safely stored in the classroom. The second purpose is to reduce the size of binder students are carrying around.
